Comments:

Wichita Northwest blew everyone away. The top 10 6A school scored 200 points, the most I have seen ever at this tournament. Andale 4A's #1 ranked team scored 156. We finished 4th 3 points behind Dodge City. I thought we wrestled pretty well, we are always going to have matches we lose that I think we should of won, but all in all 4th place at a tournament of this caliber, and with only getting 8 guys on the mat we wrestled pretty well. Our standouts this week were Logan Livengood and Lawson Fiss. Logan majored (beat by 8 or more points) Joey Alberts of Wichita NW. Alberts was a state placer last year for Northwest. I thought Logan looked good all day, he started out slowe against a Ulysses freshman but ended up with the fall in that one, pinned his next kid easy, then stomped his kid in the finals. Fiss was equally if not more impressive, with 4 wins and 3 falls including pinning his kid in the finals. Fiss had quite a bit of weight to pull but he did it right and it paid dividends on Saturday. Our only other finalist Saturday was Patrick Weaver. He was upset by Kyle Armstrong from Andale. Arrmstrong came into the tournament ranked 6th in class 4A behind Weaver #3 and Morales #5. He will certainly move up after beating both this weekend. Weaver was a little off his game in the finals. He did tech fall his first kid in the first period (which I have never seen happen before), Patrick scored 19 points in the first period. Ty Haller lost in the semifinals to Ulysses's #2 ranked Armando Sandoval. We only lost by one, on a technical violation call. That batttle between Sandoval and Haller is going to be an interesting on all year long, we will see him at all but one tournament this year. Bradley Campbell (a move in from Burlington, CO) went 2 and 2 on the day at 170, I think he is going to try to move down to 160 this weekend. Both his matches seemed like matches he could have won, but I think sometimes when a new kid moves in nerves are an issue. I really believe that once he gets a couple of tournaments in at 160 he will be tearing it up. Zane Littell at 126 was a match away from placing, he went 3 and 2 on the day, which should bode well for him going to Ulysses this week (a tournament he won a year ago). Our new Heavyweight Alfredo Licon won his first match of his HS carreer, only to get injured in his next match. He should be okay for this weekend though. Genesis Martinez a freshman had a tough draw on Saturday, he wrestled well but dropped both matches. I think with him it is just a matter of him picking up our technique he is fantastic athlete and has lots of experience, and I think what we do technically will really benefit his style down the road. The big thing with us this year compared to last is we do not have the depth we had a year ago...I anticipate doing not quite as well team wise week in and week out like we did last year, and probably not qualifying as many for state, but I think we will place more at state this year than last, and "make things interesting the last week of February"
